

Building Update>>>

We have raised 100% of the funds needs to proceed with our new storage/multi-use and woodshop building!

The new building will stand just west of the basketball court, nestled into the woods with access from both the field and the horse trails in the woods. The 80' x 40' building will serve as off-season storage and will be available for multiuse during the camp season. In addition to this large area, there will be a new 16' x 40' woodshop, allowing for larger woodworking classes, which will look out toward the basketball court and back forty.

Clearing of the area is scheduled to take place this fall and we are currently working with prospective contractors on a construction schedule.
